#### AVOCET COTTAGE, NORTH CREAKE

Chic, stylish and oozing with creature comforts for a relaxing stay for four, this traditional brick and flint cottage is within walking distance of Creake Abbey, with its popular farmers' market, and ten minutes' drive from Burnham Market.

#### ASPALL ESCAPE, BURNHAM MARKET

Bijou and beautiful, this boutique-style retreat for two has plenty of luxury touches, a south-facing courtyard garden, off-street parking and is just ten minutes' stroll to Burnham Market's village green. Perfect for a romantic getaway.



#### THE CHAPEL, THORNHAM

The conversion of the village's former chapel has created a contemporary space for six guests. Underfloor heating runs throughout the ground floor which also has the advantage of a wet room, perfect after a walk on the beach. Three, first floor bedrooms complete this fabulous property.



#### CHARLOTTE COTTAGE, DOCKING

#### COCKLESHED HOUSE, BRANCASTER STAITHE

#### FULMAR, THORNHAM

# On your bike

Take to two wheels and savour your getaway at a slower pace with these properties that offer easy access to Norfolk's cycle trails

Where shall we go? Follow the Sustrans National Cycle Network route 1 from King's Lynn to Wighton, set off from Holme and travel the Peddars Way, a Roman road which runs 46 miles south to Knettishall Heath in Suffolk, or explore the trails at the Holkham Estate. Big Norfolk skies and open roads await...



#### OLD BARN, HOLME-NEXT-THE-SEA

Past meets present at this 350-year-old brick and flint coastal cottage which sleeps eight guests. Just minutes from the nearby nature reserve, relax in the garden room after a great day spent exploring coast and country on your bike.

#### HOPE COTTAGE, HOLME-NEXT-THE-SEA

A property made for two, Hope Cottage is a 16th century, brick and flint cottage set on the edge of Redwell Marshes and the Peddars Way. With sea views, you can even book the owner's beach hut to enjoy the coast at nearby Old Hunstanton, an easy bike ride away.



#### SEA LAVENDER HOUSE, BRANCASTER

Part of an exclusive development, this stunning, barn-style property sleeps six guests with ample space to relax after a day out on the road. Pack up the bikes and head to Holkham for a super-safe ride that's perfect if you have little ones in tow.


#### WALNUT PASTURES, THORNHAM

The French phrase, 'À la rentrée' perfectly describes the 'back to school' feeling of early autumn, a moment of new beginnings as we step into the season. Nowhere is this more evident than in nature and I plan to spend plenty of time walking the dogs at Sandringham and Holkham to watch the colourful display of leaves in all their glory.

The crowds might thin a little as the children return to school, but there are plenty of empty nesters to fill their place, many of whom flock to the bird reserves to see the aerial trapeze of migratory birds as they start their long journey south. From Snettisham to Titchwell, there are plenty of spots to spy the wildlife.

Norfolk's big blue skies are fantastic vear-round and one thing on my autumn 'to do' list is to head to Cromer on a stormy day to watch the waves crash. I might be tempted to take a lesson with Glide Surf School and experience the Norfolk coastline from a new perspective.

Pick-your-own is typically associated with the heat of summer, but autumn offers some delicious seasonal

> fruit too and one of my favourite places to bag some locally grown produce is Drove Orchards at Thornham. The site grows more than 160 varieties of apples and pears which you can select straight from the tree, or buy at its Farm Shop.

It's never too early to think of Christmas and New Year, and the switching on of Burnham Market's lights is one of the highlights of our own village's calendar. Why not ring the changes with a great family getaway and see 2022 in at a grand Norfolk property to celebrate?



Wells-next-the-Sea has it all with its pretty quay, endless beach walks and big blue skies

Once a bustling fishing and sea port that supplied grain to London and malt to Holland, Wells-next-the-Sea's historic roots are still evident today with the iconic granary tower which overhangs the town's quay. While a small number of fishing boats still occupy the harbour, today the quay is filled with happy holidaymakers trying to catch a crab over the harbour wall or sampling fish and chips from the town's famous French's

restaurant. From here, head into town and to The Buttlands, a tree-lined square with two of the town's highly-regarded pubs, or take the mile-long walk along the sea wall to the beach and ride the narrowgauge railway on your return.



#### THE COTTAGE, WELLS-NEXT-THE-SEA

Enjoy a relaxing stay for two with the dog at this coastal bolthole, a traditional cottage in the heart of the town and just a short walk to the quay, which has been beautifully decorated in a comfortable, contemporary style.



#### BAILEY WICK COTTAGE, WELLS-NEXT-THE-SEA

Fully renovated in 2020, this fabulous open plan period cottage boasts a stylish interior which makes the most of the property's period features. With two bedrooms sleeping four guests, the town centre and quay are a short walk away.



#### HARBOUR VIEW, WELLS-NEXT-THE-SEA

Located in a small, exclusive development, minutes from the quay, this chic and stylish, two-storey townhouse sleeps eight guests plus a family dog and enjoys stunning views across the marshes from the lounge and two of the property's bedrooms.


#### DOGGER INN. WELLS-NEXT-THE-SEA

As the name suggests, this Grade II listed cottage dates back to 1650 and was run as a public house for more than 200 years before being transformed into a luxurious holiday home. Sleeping up to eight, there is plenty to occupy guests including football and pool tables.



#### WELLS BEACH HUT, WELLS-NEXT-THE-SEA

As one of the area's best beaches, you can enjoy a prime spot even if you aren't staying in town by booking a hut for the week. Built in 2017 and newly decorated, spend long days enjoying the outlook, watching the weather roll by and taking an occasional dip in the water.



For 125 years, golfers have enjoyed **Hunstanton Golf** Club's sandy dunes and links grasses. Overlooking The Wash, the east coast's only westfacing point, relax after a game and take in a stunning sunset over a sundowner.
